## Selection Committee Report – September 2020

There are three parts to this report:

1. Tutor.com
2. Ulster County Legislature Funding Request
3. Statistics for most of the Ulster County exclusive databases

### Part 1: Tutor.com

The selection committee recommends strongly that the libraries purchase Tutor.com. This resource will help us to support schools, children, and parents who are struggling with the changes brought about by the pandemic. It will also send a strong message to the Ulster County Legislature that we support education. However, the UCLA does not have the resources available so most of the funding will have to come directly from the individual libraries.

FAQs:

#### What does 7 hours of tutoring mean?

The seven hours of tutoring is for seven hours of live tutoring per day, 7 days a week that provides unlimited access to all residents of the county--we choose what hours those are. For example, we could have those hours run from 2:00 PM to 9:00 PM seven days a week. During those hours, any library user can connect with a tutor for a one-on-one live tutoring session. There is no limit to the number of users during that time. We can adjust the hours if usage data shows a need to move them earlier or later.

#### Is the communication by verbal or by chat?

The student has the option of chat only or they can turn on audio for verbal communication. A little overview is available here:

#### What is included?

- Support in over [95 subjects](#) and test prep areas
- One-to-one, on-demand homework help & tutoring
- The Princeton Review SAT/ACT Essentials test prep
- Self-study tools such as practice quizzes and flashcards
- Fully vetted educational and job search resources

*Recommendation:* The committee recommends that the UCLA use \$1000 of funds from the checking account to put towards the estimate of \$.07 per year that covered the entire county. (Some libraries opted not to join which would increase this cost per library.) The cost of Tutor.com for the entire population of Ulster County for seven hours of use is \$12,950. The annual subscription will run from Oct 2020-Sep 2021.

Note: The checking account has \$5814.31 available to spend. We will soon be adding membership dues for 2021. In addition, we did not have an annual meeting this year which cut down on expenses.

The committee discussed this funding request before it was submitted to the Ulster County Legislature.

Increasing frustration with ProQuest's technology led partially to the recommendation to replace Ancestry with Tutor.com. Although we may lose out on the deal that they offered us for all three databases, it was felt that the need to support education was greater at this time. We have more than met our goal to support databases for at least three years as we have records going back to 2017. Hopefully, this will give libraries who decide to purchase the database alone time to put plans into place for next year.

We do not yet know what will happen with AcornTV, Great Courses, and Qello. Overdrive just purchased the company, and they have not indicated what their plans are. However, the statistics (below) are enough to warrant putting the funding in place for another year.

We have not negotiated a capped contract with Kanopy but the numbers indicate that we should anticipate a rise in costs.

The committee felt that many of the Zinio magazines have not performed well enough to continue funding as many. It is a good time to review all the eMagazines as Central Library may be changing their funding levels.

The 21-member libraries that make up the Ulster County Library Association work collaboratively to support our entire service area of 180,000 residents and provide the best possible library services to our varied communities. For this reason, the Ulster County Library Association uses the legislative funds received in common to support the Ulster County Info Portal <http://uclib.org/infoportal/>. This suite of resources provides equity in digital library services across the diverse communities of Ulster County.

Libraries have historically been impacted by the ways in which individuals engage with technology; how they seek, access, and use information. Web-based content and electronic media has changed the dynamics of how libraries operate and manage their collections. As residents of all ages become more technically proficient, they look to their libraries to provide resources that meet their myriad needs and interests that are also accessible from anywhere they can be online. Tablets and smartphones have become everyday tools for many library users who see their mobile devices as portals to all the services they need, including those provided by their public libraries. While we continue to provide more traditional services and programs, libraries have also become leaders in building digitally inclusive communities that support individual opportunity and community progress.

Ulster County Library Association's request for 2021 funding shows an increase for the coming year to reflect the expanding demand for greater quantity and variety of resources to support students of all ages in an ongoing distance learning and homeschooling environment. These are library offerings that patrons can access at any time, from any place, can't get lost or damaged, don't take up shelf space, and don't require a trip to the library. They are equally accessible to all county residents regardless of their "home" library.

In response to the needs revealed by the global pandemic and the necessary restrictions imposed to maintain the health and safety of our communities, we are shifting our focus somewhat to resources that will provide greater support for students and families to augment the virtual instructional time they are receiving from classroom teachers. In addition to Tumblebooks, Tumblemath, Universal Class, and Mango Languages, we will be adding Tutor.com to the suite of educational resources available to all Ulster County residents with their library card. The Tutor.com Learning Suite combines live one-on-one online tutoring, asynchronous homework help, test preparation, and career support with a variety of self-study resources to provide a well-balanced and flexible educational environment designed to meet the individual needs of all learners. Tutor.com is designed to support learners from kindergarten through early college as well as job seekers.

In addition to support for distance learning, the Ulster County Library Association continues to support resident's personal growth and recreational needs by offering patrons access to streaming video content, downloadable ebooks and eaudio books for readers of all ages, and digital magazines covering a broad range of topics. These offerings have been extremely well received by the residents of our communities who see 24/7 access to digital content as a natural extension of library services.

As we expand our efforts to create user centered libraries, Ulster County libraries are eager to be responsive to the needs of all community members in order to provide the best possible library service throughout Ulster County. By expanding our digital and streaming offerings, we are creating collections that have no physical boundary, round the clock availability, multiple simultaneous access, are not limited by building space, and are easily accessible.
